Dietitians who are registered in a jurisdiction outside of Saskatchewan who provide services to residents of Saskatchewan must comply with registration requirements and adhere to the regulatory requirements in the jurisdiction where they are licensed as well as in Saskatchewan.

For the purposes of determining residency, SCD will defer to the Saskatchewan Health eligibility criteria, accessed [here](#).

**PROCEDURE**

1. A Dietitian licensed by SCD who provides virtual dietetic services to clients who reside outside of Saskatchewan must:
  - a. verify and comply with the registration requirements and regulatory standards (eg. Standards of practice, scope of practice, mandatory liability insurance) of the dietetic regulatory body in the jurisdiction where the client resides
  - b. ensure the client is aware that they are a licensed member of SCD.
  
2. Dietitians who are registered in a jurisdiction outside of Saskatchewan who are providing in person dietetic services in Saskatchewan to residents of Saskatchewan and using the protected titles of dietitian, registered dietitian or professional dietitian must be licensed with SCD.
  
3. Dietitians who are registered in a jurisdiction outside of Saskatchewan who are providing virtual dietetic services to residents of Saskatchewan and use the protected titles of dietitian, registered dietitian or professional dietitian must be licensed with SCD.
  
4. Failure to comply with the requirements as outlined above for dietitians registered in jurisdictions outside of Saskatchewan may result in SCD making a complaint in that dietitian’s home jurisdiction and/or give grounds for SCD to refuse future licence applications due to good character requirements.
